2014 Competition Regulations

Dear Club Representatives,

I write to communicate the final Competition Regulations for the 2014 competitions.

During July and September 2013 Football NSW invited Applicant Clubs to the 2014 Competitions to provide feedback on the draft Equipment and Commercial Regulations. This process was conducted to provide the Clubs an opportunity to contribute to the development of the regulations that govern the competition they participate in, and enable Football NSW to issue regulations that better reflect the experience of the stakeholders.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the clubs for their submissions in review of the draft regulations. Please find following a link to the final regulations. Attached as annexures 1 and 2 is a table of amendments to the draft regulations and a table identifying requested amendments that were considered but declined.



Rationale

The amendments for eligibility to Championships Series matches seek to:

- Allow clubs to more easily manage the eligibility of their players from the Premiership to Championship
- Support players from younger age groups playing up age grades to promote development and squad depth without impacting on their registered age grade team
- Protect the integrity of the women's Reserve Grade competitions by limiting 1st grade players playing down
- Develop principles that are applicable to all leagues equally
- Present the information in an more easily discernable manner

Rationale

The amendments seek to:

- Correct a typographic error that retained the average player points from 2013
- Correct the absence of reference to the 10 point base for every player in the salary cap
- Define the requirement to include U20 professional players in the 1st grade squad ahead of U20 amateur players, limiting the scope for abuse of loop holes

The definition has been amended to cater for competitions where a club may be playing matches against multiple opponents on a given weekend (i.e. NPL NSW Men’s 1 and 2 where clubs may be in NPL1 “Senior” and NPL2 “Junior” competitions). By example, a player serving his last fixture suspension in U15 of a club in NPL2 cannot take the field for the U16 team of that Club participating in NPL1 on the same weekend.
