# Why do an Introduction to Football First Aid Course?

- When there's no first aid person available, would you know what to do if a player was injured?
- This short, simple, interactive and practical course will give you the skills and confidence to handle this situation.

## Who should do the course?

## **Introduction to First Aid Principles**

This course will provide First Aid Principles and basic skills. You will learn:

- how to initially care for an injured player;
- to identify when to refer the player for medical attention;
- when to call an ambulance.

## What will you learn?

- Develop emergency planning skills
- Gain an understanding of hygiene and procedures to reduce contamination and infection
- Practice methods of dealing with Football Specific Injuries
- Use safe methods to transport an injured player
- Develop Concussion Recognition and initial management skills
- Recognise a Cardiac Arrest and practice initial response

#### **Details of Course**

- The course will be held at the club's indoor venue, at a time convenient for the club
- Interested individuals can join a "club" course with a minimum of 10 participants and a maximum of 30 for each course
- The course will run for  $2 2\frac{1}{2}$  hours
- Cost of course is \$20 per attendee (this will include course notes and a Certificate of Completion)
- A free First Aid Kit valued at \$180 will be provided to any club that has 20 or more attendees
