2015 Stadium Technical Requirements

Dear Colleagues,

I write to communicate an amendment to the Stadium Technical Requirements ahead of the 2015 football season.

At their meeting on 1 May 2014 the Football NSW Board approved an amendment to the 2015 Stadium Technical Requirements relating specifically to stadium seating. Attached as Annexure 1 is a table outing the amendment to the requirement.

In approving the change to the requirement, the board considered;

- A review of the downwards trend in attendance at National Premier League NSW Men's 1 first grade matches, dropping from an average in 2012 of 525 spectators to 297 in 2013 (against a minimum seating standard of 1,500 seats)
- The significant current non-compliance to the requirements, with only 7 of the 12 NPL1 and 4 of the 12 NPL2 clubs meeting the criteria relevant to their respective leagues
- The 2014 seating criteria created an artificial ceiling that obstructs promotion and relegation in senior football
- Local Councils, who are the primary funding source for venue redevelopment, reluctance to invest in grandstand seating that is in the most part left vacant
- Communicating a position to the football clubs, with advance notice to the 2015 season commencing, to allow decisions on facility funding to be made that results in investment to key football areas (i.e. quality of playing surfaces and floodlighting) rather than extensions to spectator seating that is surplus to attendance

As the amendments apply specifically to the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's 1 and 2 competitions, the topic was tabled for discussion by the Men's Premier Competitions Standing Committee. The recommendation from the Standing Committee was for the proposed amendments to be recommended to the Football NSW Board.

Section 6: Spectator Facilities Article 3: Seating

3. Seating

Previous Text

Following are the minimum Covered and Open Air Seating requirements for Stadiums;

| League | Covered Seating | Open Air Seating |

Covered Seating is defined as seating in a sheltered, purpose built covered Grandstand constructed of a material which protects spectators from the elements, or a private box or room enclosed by glass.

Seating can be either bench or individual bucket style.

In calculating the numbers of spectators a bench seat accommodates, the equation of two (2) people to every one (1) metre of bench seating is to be used.

All seating must be elevated and tiered.

Amended Text

3. Seating

a) Following are the minimum Covered and Open Air Seating requirements for Stadiums;

- b) Under cover seating is defined as seating in a sheltered, purpose built covered Grandstand constructed of a material which protects spectators from the elements, or a private box or room enclosed by glass
- c) Seating can be either bench or individual bucket style
- d) In calculating the numbers of spectators a bench seat accommodates, the equation of two (2) people to every one (1) metre of bench seating is to be used
- e) All seating must be elevated and tiered
- Football NSW will take into consideration Stadiums with capacity in excess of the minimum standard when determining locations for the Championships Series of each respective League



Rationale

The amendments above seek to:

- Set a reasonable and realistic standard considering historic attendance and standing of the competitions
- Motivate clubs to seek funding for "football" objectives including the field of play, floodlighting and coaching structures
- Consider local government preference to invest money on outcomes that have a benefit to the community (i.e. fields and floodlights) rather than stadium seating which is generally left empty
- Remove the artificial ceiling to promotion and relegation in senior football
- Recognise that in their current condition, the majority of venues do not meet the 2014 Stadium seating minimum standards
